FAQs

- 1. Does robotics cost anything?
 - a. Yes and No.
 - i. There is no upfront costs but participants <u>may</u> be asked to purchase their own Team T-shirts.
 - ii. Parents are asked to volunteer time in support of the program and there is a deposit check attached to that agreement. If parents fail to volunteer then they forfeit their deposit check.
 - iii. Teams that qualify for larger out of state tournaments are often asked to pitch in money to help cover hotels.
- 2. How many hours do I have to volunteer?
 - a. Currently we are hosting the state tournaments for both VEX and VEX leagues which means we have two huge tournaments a year and we need lots of help to host them. Because of this we are currently asking parents to volunteer at least 20 hours through the course of the year.
- 3. Is working at a tournament the only way I can volunteer?
 - a. No, we have lots of ways to help our program including but not limited to attending Tiger Nation meetings, coaching an elementary team, calling sponsors, donating food, helping to supervise practices...
- 4. How much is the deposit check?
 - a. \$250 that is held in a deposit box until May
- 5. How do students get to out of town tournaments?
 - a. The school board has generously given us funding to have bussing to tournaments within a 3 hour radius. Tournaments outside of that range we tend to carpool.
- 6. How long is the season?
 - The season for the younger and older kids runs from August through the end of February
- 7. How often do teams practice?
 - a. Younger kids grades 4-6 tend to practice 2 nights a week.
 - b. Older kids grades 7-12 tend to practice 3 nights a week.
- 8. What days and times do teams practice?
 - a. Practice dates and times are different for different coaches. Elementary teams tend to practice in the evening, where middle and high school teams tend to practice right after school.
